BUILD YOUR OWN WORMERY!

Follow these simple steps to create your own mini worm habitat and learn about how worms help the environment.

What You'll Need:

- A clear plastic bottle or jar (2L bottles work well)
- Scissors (ask an adult for help!)
- Soil (from the garden)
- Sand (to create layers)

- Compost or leaf litter
- Worms (collected from the garden or compost bin)
- Leaves & small food scraps (banana peel, apple core, etc.)
- Spray bottle with water
- Dark paper or fabric (to cover the wormery)
- Elastic band or tape

How to Build Your Wormery:

- 1 If using a plastic bottle, carefully cut off the top (about 5cm down). Rinse the bottle or jar with water and let it dry.
- 2 Add a layer of sand (about 2cm deep). Add a layer of soil (about 4–5cm). Repeat layers of sand and soil until the container is nearly full. Add some compost or leaf litter on top.
- 3 Add Worms & Food Gently place worms into the wormery.

Add small bits of food scraps (avoid citrus, onions, or dairy).

Lightly mist with water to keep the soil damp (but not too wet!).

4 Cover & Observe - Wrap the sides with dark paper or fabric to block out light.

Secure with an elastic band or tape. - Leave the top open or poke small holes to allow air in.

Looking After Your Wormery:

- Keep it damp Spray with water if the soil looks dry.
- ✓ Feed the worms Add small food scraps every few days.
- Keep it dark Worms like the dark, so keep it covered.
- ✓ Don't shake it Worms need a stable home!
- Check their progress Peek inside every few days to see the tunnels.



After 2–3 weeks, gently release the worms into your garden or compost bin so they can continue their good work!
